This year the national Tri-M chair has made it even more affordable to have a Tri-M chapter at your school. Chapter fees are now assessed according to the number of students enrolled in either your high school or middle school. For enrollment less than 500 the fee is \$50, for enrollment of 500-999 the fee is \$75, for enrollment of 1000-1999 the fee is \$100, and for enrollment of 2000 or more the fee is \$125.
